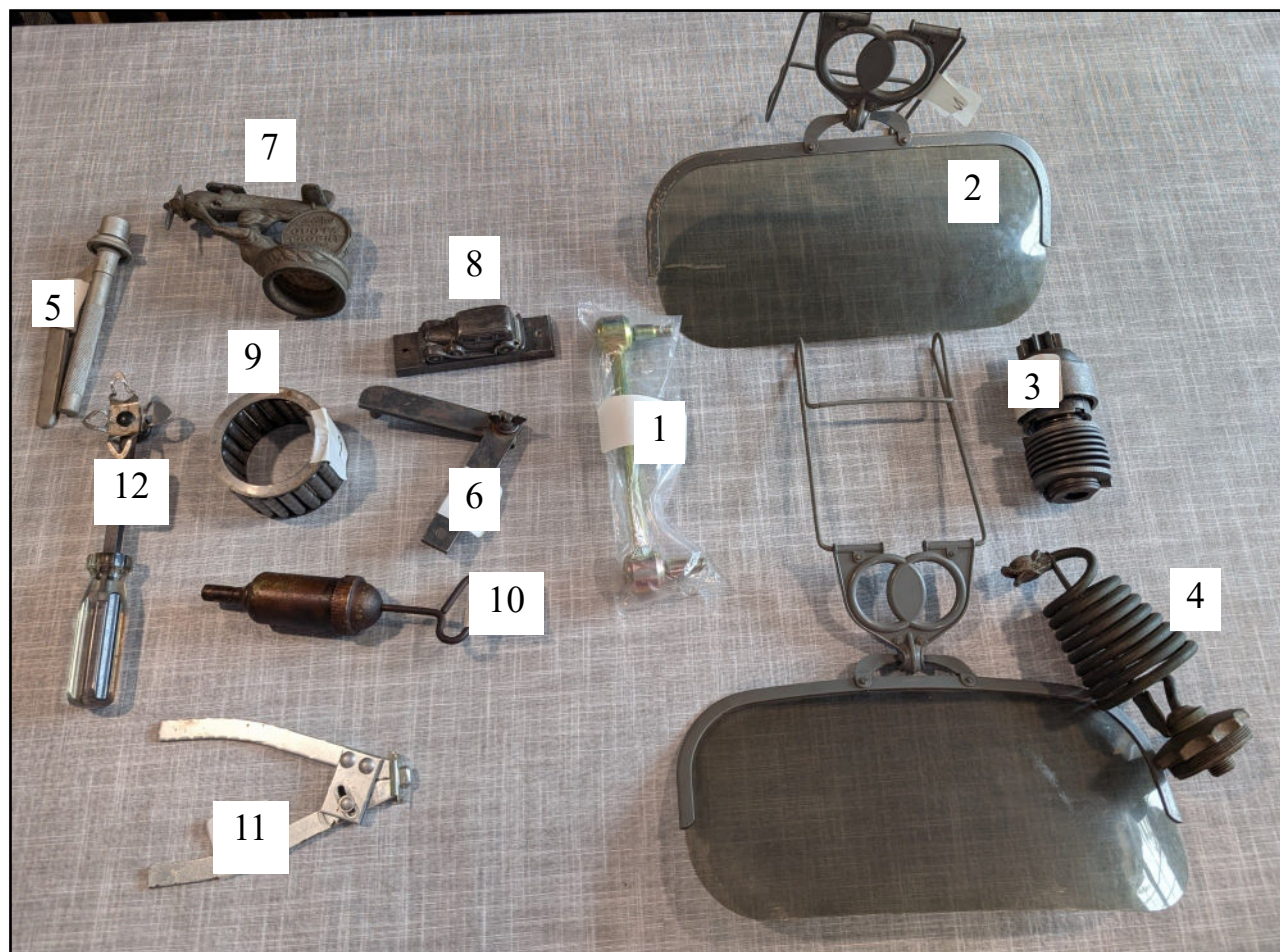

The meeting was called to order at 1:30 pm. Jenifer welcomed everyone, and passed out a "get to know me" activity that she asked everyone to complete and return to her by the end of the meeting.

Members meeting update: Jenifer announced that VP Rich Fink will lead the Pledge of Allegiance at the monthly meetings. She asked if anyone had any suggestions regarding the format of the monthly meeting agenda. It was agreed that it should be kept the same.

Current membership: Bill reported that 32 out of 45 members have paid their dues for the upcoming year. Bill gave Jen a list of members who have not yet paid, and she will contact them. Denny has sent information and invitations to two prospective members. He has not heard back from either of them, but he will contact them again.

Bill showed us a poster showcasing his car that his son developed using QR codes to provide further information. He suggested that we think about using QR codes on our literature, business cards that will lead people to our website, and more information about our club. Rich shared samples of business cards from other car clubs with QR codes on them. A discussion was held about the idea of developing a business card for Canton Chapter, as well as having the club purchase a quantity of them and distribute them to members. Members could then share this information with others. Rich and Kat Fink agreed to put together sample brochures and business cards with QR codes, and bring them to a membership meeting for suggestions and approval.

Hosting Incentives: A choice of a free meal ticket or a \$25 gas card is given to members who host a meeting. The meal tickets are printed and copied by the club at no cost for the ticket. The club absorbs the cost of the meal when the ticket is presented. The gas cards are purchased by the club.

Spring 2027 and Fall 2028 Regional Meets: Canton Chapter is scheduled to host the Spring 2027 and Fall 2028 Regional meets. Jenifer asked for ideas for where to hold the meets, and possible activities. Suggestions and discussion included Marietta, Detroit, Stan Hywett, and Mansfield. A consensus was made that Jenifer looked into Mansfield for the Spring 2027 meet, and Denny looked into Marietta for Fall 2028.

Treasurers Report: Bill reported the balances of the savings and checking accounts, and all bills have been paid.

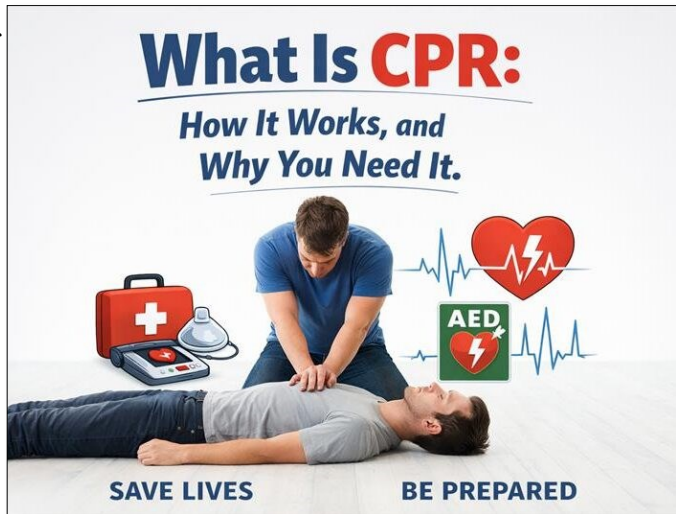
NEXT MEETING
